The Lord was so pleased at his obedience and promised that every family on earth would be blessed through him.



When God called him to leave his hometown and his father's household, he implicitly obeyed even though he did not know where he was going. He loved God more than his family.

*I'm alive just because my body touched his bones!*

This man did not ask for riches or treasures, nor did he ask for honour and glory when his master gave him a choice, instead he asked for a double portion of the anointing of the Spirit.



*I don't want honour or riches. I want a double measure of the Lord's Spirit.*



When Naaman offered him money after he was healed, this man declined it seeing that Naaman was not whole hearted.



*I'd rather want you to be whole hearted to God than receive your gifts.*
